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Dear Friend,

It is with great urgency that I send you the enclosed invitation and ask that you RSVP to it today.

Your invitation asks you to support an urgent new project to halt a shameless attempt by the Big Labor Bosses to expand their power at the expense of our homeland security and troops overseas.

Its purpose is to prevent the Big Labor Bosses from cynically exploiting the ongoing war on terror and the struggle against Iraq to expand their power over America's work force...

... and I'll explain why its mission is so very important to America's economic and military security in a moment.

But first, please <u>check "YES</u>" or "<u>NO</u>" on the enclosed <u>RSVP</u>.

Then <u>use</u> the pre-addressed return envelope to mail it back without delay.

If your answer is "NO," I will understand. But I will also be very disappointed and deeply concerned.

<u>Why</u>? Because the union bosses' selfish drive to use the national emergencies we face today to grab more power, presents <u>a</u> <u>clear-and-present-danger</u> to the security of the United States at home and the safety of our Armed Forces overseas...

.. and here's how and why.

As our nation wages a campaign to crush the worldwide terrorist network, the Big Labor Bosses of the AFL-CIO and other major unions are all *talking* a good game about "*national unity*."

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But behind the scenes, they are exploiting the war effort to quietly grab more power and control over America's economy and workforce. <u>Shocking</u>? Yes. But not surprising, given the history of how Big Labor notoriously exploited the Second World War and other times of crisis to expand dramatically its power at the expense of the war effort. ¥

Before World War II, only 20 percent of unionized employees were governed by contracts that required forced union dues payments as a condition of employment.

By 1942 that percentage shot up to 60 percent, and by 1947 it was at a whopping 78 percent.

How and why did that happen?

It happened because, as the government became more deeply involved in key defense-related industries, the union bosses realized that their leverage increased along with the nation's war needs.

They therefore <u>instigated numerous violent and crippling</u> <u>strikes</u> that gave a sympathetic President, Franklin Roosevelt, the excuse he needed to give the union bosses the power they craved.

For the sake of "labor peace," Roosevelt created the biased <u>National War Labor Board (NWLB)</u>, giving the Big Labor Bosses authority over just about every industry in wartime America.

Of course, "labor peace" never did truly develop during the war, as the number of strikes rose 26 percent in 1943, 32 percent in 1944, and declined by only four percent in 1945.

Nevertheless, history is now repeating itself as the union bosses strive to use the war on terror as cover for a new drive for power.

Examples? They are as numerous as they are sickening:

- ** As the World Trade Center and Pentagon still
 smoldered, high-paid union lobbyists convinced
 Democrat Senators Ted Kennedy and <u>Hillary Rodham</u>
 <u>Clinton</u> to try ramming through legislation to <u>force</u>
 <u>the nation's firefighters and policemen</u> to accept
 union bosses as their exclusive workplace spokesmen.
- ** Thanks to pro-worker Senators and grassroots activists, this despicable effort narrowly failed. But Harold Schaitberger, president of the AFL-CIO's Firefighters Union vowed, "We will be back with a vengeance."

- ** At the same time, <u>union bosses launched a wave of</u> <u>crippling strikes</u>, the largest of which was in Minnesota, where union bosses ordered a massive 23,000strong strike by government employees just as state officials were trying to deal with serious life-anddeath health and security concerns.
- ** Also, at the same time, the still intact <u>Clinton</u> <u>National Labor Relations Board</u> issued a slew of new rulings expanding union coercive power in the wake of 9/11.
- ** More recently, top officials of the <u>International</u> <u>Association of Machinists and Aerospace Workers (IAM)</u> union shamefully exploited the nation's critical war needs when they shut down production on the crucial F-22 fighter jet and C130-J military transport plane in a blatant attempt to increase their power.
- ** Worse still, bosses of the <u>International Longshore and</u> <u>Warehouse Union (ILWU)</u> also exploited America's urgent economic and national security needs to increase their power last fall by forcing a crippling shutdown of ALL West Coast shipping ports.
- ** And -- worst of all -- Tom Daschle, Joe Lieberman and other U.S. Senate allies of the union bosses held up President Bush's proposal to create a much-needed <u>Homeland Security Department</u> in <u>a shameless attempt</u> to give Big Labor veto power over how the Department is set up and operated.

Sadly, I could go on and on.

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Through cynical post-9/11 maneuvering, <u>Kennedy</u>, <u>Clinton</u> and others sought to federally mandate that all state and local governments anoint union officials as the monopoly bargaining agents for <u>local police</u>, <u>firefighters</u>, <u>paramedics</u> and others on whom we would all depend in another 9/11-type attack.

They launched a reckless drive to hand union bosses operational control over the Homeland Security Department.

And, even as our troops were on their way to Afghanistan and other terror hot spots -- union officials called a crippling strike at a military tank manufacturing plant in Lima, Ohio.

But the worst part is this: The union bosses have only just begun exploiting the war effort and America's security needs.

That is why I was relieved when I heard that the <u>National Right</u> to Work Foundation was launching an aggressive campaign to fight this shameful, post-9/11 power grab by Big Labor.

- ++ <u>fought for</u> the rights of over 200,000 employees in more than 2,000 separate cases;
- ++ <u>achieved</u> landmark victories in numerous federal court cases -- including seven before the U.S. Supreme Court -- that have loosened the grip of coercive union power over the American economy, political system and millions of workers. Their celebrated victories include Communications Workers v. Beck, Chicago Teachers Union v. Hudson, and Ellis v. Railway Clerks; and
- ++ <u>recruited</u> more than 300,000 Americans willing to contribute to these strategic legal battles.

In short, the Foundation and its supporters strongly believe that an individual's constitutional rights take precedence over the power grabs of union bosses. And believe me, as someone who is doing all he can in the United States Congress to help the President protect our country and workers' rights...

... <u>I am thrilled</u> that the National Right to Work Foundation has decided to take on the union bosses' <u>cynical and selfish drive to use the</u> <u>nation's security needs as a wedge</u> to gain more power over workers and their rights.
